Listed below are the goals and objectives:

Outcome 1 – 80% of first-time ever in college (FTEIC) students will pass 100% of the vital student portal training module.

Outcome 2 – Increase number of first-time ever in college (FTEIC) students completing orientation within their first 21 hours to ______ in 2019-2020 compared to 36% in 2018-2019,

Goal #2 – First-time ever in college (FTEIC) students will become engaged with faculty in a well-designed, well-orchestrated advising plan that leads to student success.

Outcome 1 – 65% of first-time ever in college (FTEIC) students will be required to meet with their advisor or counselor at least twice a semester.

Outcome 2 – 65% of first-time ever in college (FTEIC) students will develop a personalized educational plan that is aligned with their academic and career goals.
